Question 3:

Capital Outlay Question for Landfill Capping:

Shall the Town of Abington be allowed to assess an additional \$275,000.00 in real estate and personal property taxes for the purposes of paying for the first phase of the capping of the Town's landfill located at Groveland Street in the Town for the fiscal year beginning July first, two thousand and ten?
